Program Suspensions

Faculty Policy Committee has written a *Resolution about Ensuring Faculty Input on Budgetary Decisions and Program Suspensions* to express our deep concerns about the impact Cal State LA budget decisions will have on faculty positions, program suspensions, and department and colleges.

FPC would like to have the *Resolution about Ensuring Faculty Input on Budgetary Decisions and Program Suspensions* added to Academic Senate agenda for March 11, 2025, as a first-reading item, with a motion to waive the first-reading item rule in light of the urgency.

Faculty Policy Committee Resolution about Ensuring Faculty Input on Budgetary Decisions and Program Suspensions

Whereas Cal State LA will experience a projected \$24 million loss in funding for 2025-2026 (FY) in addition to its existing \$32.4 million deficit with a continuing decrease in student enrollment; and

Whereas the CSU has, in recent years, decreased its spending on instruction as a percentage of the total budget, while increasing its spending on non-instructional pursuits – including private investments, corporate consultants, management personnel, and policing – as a percentage of the total budget, signifying its waning commitment to our central mission, the instruction of students; and

Whereas President Eanes indicated at the February 11th meeting of the Academic Senate meeting that department dissolution was not off the table in 2025-2026; and

Whereas the Cal State LA administration via the Chancellor's Office (CO) has provided CFA-LA with an official notice to invoke their rights for layoffs on our campus, as outlined in their obligation in Article 38 of the collective bargaining agreement; and

Whereas other CSU campuses, such as Sonoma State, have experienced devastating cuts to faculty, staff, and instructional support programs, which has resulted in the gutting of the entire campus and the undercutting of the CSU's mission; and

Whereas Cal State LA, as it explores ways to reduce spending, has created the administrative committee titled Cal State LA Budget and Planning Committee, whose faculty representation is comprised of only one faculty representative per college; and

 Whereas there exists clear policy in the Faculty Handbook governing department dissolution and merger (Ch. 3 Formation, Dissolution, Relocation or Merger of Departments/ Division/ Schools) as well as academic program suspension and discontinuance (Ch. 4 Policy and Procedures for Temporary Suspension of Academic Programs; Policy and Procedures for Academic Program Discontinuance); and

Whereas shared governance is a core principle at the heart of the mission and successful functioning of the University; and

Whereas the University-wide Guiding Principles of Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Belonging at Cal State (Ch. 6) reflect the identity of the University in its commitment to these core values; and

Therefore, be it resolved that the Academic Senate calls upon the administration to protect students and faculty by providing representation of bargaining units, and including representatives from the United Auto Workers Union (Academic Student Employees) and the California Faculty Association on the Cal State LA Budget and Planning Committee; and

47 48 49 50 51	Therefore, be it further resolved that the Cal State LA Academic Senate urges the administration to abide by the principles of shared governance and the policies and procedures for dissolution and merger of academic units and suspension and discontinuance of academic programs as described in the Faculty Handbook; and

53	protect the interests of Cal State LA students and faculty and engage in consultation when
54	proposing measures to mitigate the financial deficits, including, but not limited to program
55	discontinuance or merging, faculty layoffs, increasing course caps, and other changes that may
56	impact faculty workload and student opportunities; and

58	Therefore, be it resolved that the Academic Senate urges the administration of Cal State LA to
59	recognize the value of and protection of programs focused on Ethnic Studies and Diversity,
60	Equity, and Inclusion such as those in the College of Ethnic Studies and the Department of
