ACCELERATED BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (ABSN) PROGRAM SUMMER 2025 APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The ABSN program is for non-RN students who have a bachelor's degree in a field other than nursing (this degree must have been obtained by the end of Fall 2024 or earlier in order to apply). Students admitted to the ABSN Program in Summer 2025 will begin classes on Monday, June 2nd, 2025. A BSN degree will be awarded upon successful completion of this 15-month program.

ABSN students who are interested in our MSN program must have successfully completed the ABSN program prior to the start of this graduate program, and have successfully passed the NCLEX-RN exam before the start of their second semester of the MSN program. MSN applicants will be *considered* for this graduate program if an application to *Cal State Apply* is submitted during the required time period and they have participated in the MSN program interview process. MSN faculty option coordinators will make the final decisions for admittance into this graduate nursing program.

The 2025 cycle will be a digital application process utilizing the NursingCAS website for documentation submission: www.nursingcas.org. Do not bring your ABSN application materials to the Chin School of Nursing in person.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Our application cycle will open on Friday, November 1, 2024 and will close on Tuesday, January 7, 2025.

The application procedure for the ABSN Program is a four-step process:

Step 1: Submission of the following ABSN application materials (electronic) to NursingCAS:

- Two letters of recommendation
- Personal essay
- A resume outlining health care experience both paid and volunteer
- One official/sealed transcripts from each college attended, even if our ABSN program
 does not require the coursework. Official transcripts from at least one institution must
 show proof of an awarded baccalaureate degree in a field other than nursing. If you are
 taking any college courses during Fall 2024, include one unofficial transcript from the
 fall semester.
 - Please note that the <u>earliest</u> date that you can order official transcripts is June 1, 2024.

- Regardless of U.S. residency, if your undergraduate (or advanced) degree was not awarded by an institution where English is the principal language of instruction, you must submit your qualifying English Language Proficiency Exam scores by January 7, 2025 to NursingCAS. Results must be from exams taken within two years of the program's start date. - o If you attended a non-U.S./foreign college/university that does not issue official transcripts in English, please plan to also submit a certified English mirror/direct word-for-word translation (not interpretation) with the official transcript. Step 2: Applicants for the ABSN Program at Cal State LA submit their university application at a different time than other prospective students. The ABSN Program at Cal State LA is one of several programs offered through the College of Professional and Global Education (PaGE). Only those students who have met the ABSN Program's academic eligibility requirements will be contacted and instructed by PaGE representatives on how and when to apply to the University using Cal State Apply: https://www2.calstate.edu/apply. This Cal State Apply application process will take place during February 2025, not in November. Applications to the University that are submitted outside of the designated timeframe will be considered invalid, and the Cal State Apply application fee will not be refunded. Please do not apply through Cal State Apply unless you are directed to do so.

Step 3: If you are interested in requesting financial aid, applicants must complete an application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the applicable academic year at https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa. The application process for FAFSA is best done between October 2024 and the beginning of March 2025 for priority processing. All applicants are strongly urged to complete the FAFSA form as scholarships are also tied to this application.

Step 4: The ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) must be taken between June 1, 2024 through January 7, 2025, and may only be taken once during this timeframe. **Applicants are responsible for uploading their ATI TEAS test results to the NursingCAS website**. The score report that we require is titled, "Individual Performance Profile," and contains a bar graph with your national and program rank percentile scores. Do not rely on ATI to send your test results to our School of Nursing. You may download your results and include it in your ABSN application on NursingCAS. The ABSN Program Coordinator must receive your test results uploaded to your completed NursingCAS application by the deadline date of **Tuesday**,

January 7, 2025. Test results received after January 7th will be considered invalid and the applicant will not be considered for our ABSN 2025 cohort.

PLEASE NOTE:

- The ABSN Program is administered on a self-support basis by the College of Professional and Global Education (PaGE). ABSN Summer 2025 course fees will be \$595.00* per semester unit (53 units for the program). The total tuition cost of the ABSN portion will be approximately \$32,000*. If students are admitted into the MSN program, the tuition for that program will be at the University's traditional full-time graduate student rate.

 *The ABSN per-unit cost is subject to change.
- Students who qualify for the Cal-Vet Fee Waiver should note that it only waives statewide mandated fees. Self-support (extension) fees are not waived. Therefore, the Cal-Vet Fee Waiver <u>cannot</u> be used for any program or courses offered by the College of Professional and Global Education. This includes the ABSN Program and Open University. Contact the Cal State LA Veterans Resource Office at (323) 343-5080 to inquire about educational programs that qualify under the Cal-Vet fee waiver program at Cal State LA.
- All ABSN applicants must have completed the following prerequisites (or their
 equivalents as determined by the ABSN Program Coordinator) with at least a "C" grade
 or higher, with the exception of the four science with lab courses which must be
 completed with at least a "B" grade or higher, in order to be considered as an
 eligible ABSN applicant:
 - Human Anatomy with lab and Physiology with lab (BIOL 2030 4 semester units
 & BIOL 2040 4 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
 - Microbiology with lab (MICR 2010 3 semester units & MICR 2020 1 semester unit, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
 - o **Chemistry with lab** (CHEM 1010 4 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
 - o **Inferential Statistics** (MATH 2740 3 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
 - Critical Thinking (e.g. COMM 1200, ENGL 1050, etc. 3 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
- Each prerequisite course may only be repeated once, and the course grades from both
 attempts will be averaged. All four sciences with lab prerequisite courses must be
 completed by the end of the Fall 2024 quarter/semester in order to apply for the
 ABSN Summer 2025 cohort.
- Prerequisite equivalency will be evaluated based on two factors: 1) the number of units—each course must meet the minimum units as its Cal State LA equivalent (4

semester units or six quarter units); 2) the course description and syllabus must fulfill similar course learning objectives, i.e. Biology will not meet the Microbiology requirement.

- Any other prerequisites aside from the sciences that have not been completed by the end of Fall 2024 must be discussed with the ABSN Program Coordinator. If an approval to apply is granted by the ABSN Program Coordinator, proof of concurrent enrollment of the remaining prerequisite(s) will be required. Successful completion of the remaining prerequisite(s) must be Left before May 1, 2025. Two expedited official transcript copies must be requested and sent to the ABSN Program Coordinator. Priority for admission may be granted to those who have already completed all of their required courses and have submitted all of their official transcripts.
- The following three courses are required for Graduation. It is **highly recommended** that they be completed prior to the start of the program as they are not part of the ABSN coursework and the student will have to take them at another college/university in addition to current ABSN coursework.
 - Human Growth and Development (PSY 1600 3 semester units, Cal State LA -Lifespan psychology course covering birth to later life or Equivalent*)
 - Intro to Sociology or Cultural Anthropology (SOC 2010 or ANTH 1500 3 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)
 - Human Nutrition (NTRS 2500 or NTRS 3170 3 semester units, Cal State LA or Equivalent)

*Intro to Psychology will <u>not</u> meet the Human Growth and Development requirement

- All applicants are required to be computer literate and must be able to use word processing (Word, PPT), email, and data search programs.
- The main mode of communication will be via email. Applicants will receive verification that their application materials have been received by the Chin School of Nursing ABSN Program via the email address listed on their ABSN Program Summer 2025 application form.
- We expect to admit up to 30 students once each year, who begin their program at the start of summer. A mandatory orientation day for those admitted to the ABSN Summer 2025 cohort will tentatively take place on Saturday, April 19, 2025. ABSN applicants should keep this date available in their calendar.
- The ABSN Summer 2025 semester will begin Monday, June 2, 2025. Prior to starting the program, accepted students will be given instructions as to our required background check process. Admitted individuals should be ready to provide an

American Heart Association BLS health care provider (CPR) certification card, documentation of their immunization records, and proof of driver's license, car insurance and health insurance.

- Students accepted into this program will be able to apply for an annual Federal Direct Loan in the amount of \$12,500 twice during the ABSN program. Students who need to supplement these loan amounts may want to consider obtaining a private loan.
- The ABSN program requires **full-time study**. For each regular school term and the two summer sessions, there will typically be two or more lecture courses and one or two laboratory/clinical courses. The program additionally has a required course during the winter intersession. An overall GPA of 3.0 or higher must be maintained while in the ABSN Program to remain in good academic standing, with no course grade lower than a "C".
- Successful completion of the ABSN Program in good academic standing enables the student to be considered for entry into the MSN program if they apply to *Cal State Apply* during the required time period and participate in the MSN program interview process. MSN option coordinators will make the final admittance decisions for the graduate nursing program based upon the interviews and student application materials. ABSN students who enter the MSN program must pass the NCLEX-RN licensure exam in order to continue into the second semester of the program. They will not be allowed to register for the spring semester until they have done so.

IMPORTANT ABSN SUMMER 2025 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- An official transcript awarding a Bachelor's degree in a field other than nursing with a
 preferred GPA of 3.0 or higher. Transcripts must also show a strong academic record
 with a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the last 90 quarter units or 60 semester units. In
 addition, a grade of "B" or higher is required in all four sciences with lab prerequisite
 courses.
- Completion of the ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) <u>is</u> required (**we do not accept the GRE**). Information about the exam itself can be found on the organization's website <u>www.atitesting.com</u>. We allow our ABSN Summer 2025 applicants to take the ATI TEAS online or at an authorized ATI testing location or PSI testing center. It is the applicant's responsibility to upload their ATI TEAS test results to their NursingCAS application prior to the application deadline. Your national percentile rank score must be 70% or higher in each of the four categories in order to be considered an eligible applicant. For the ABSN Summer 2025 application, the ATI TEAS exam may only be taken once, between June 1, 2024 and January 7, 2025. If the applicant has taken the

ATI TEAS prior to June 1, they must wait a minimum of six months (180 days) before taking the ATI TEAS for Cal State LA's ABSN program. An ATI TEAS test taken before June 1 will not be accepted.

- A typed essay (no more than two pages, double-spaced) highlighting professional goals, including your reason for entering the nursing profession and qualifications to do so.
- Two letters of recommendation written within the past year on official company letterhead (there is no designated recommendation letter form for the ABSN Program). Recommendation letters should be work, academic, or healthcare experience-related (e.g. from an employer, supervisor, or college professor). The writer should address your academic ability and characteristics that qualify you for this program and the nursing profession.
- Non-RN health care experience is strongly encouraged in order to be a competitive applicant (e.g. CNA, MA, or EMT certification/work experience, hospital volunteer experience that includes direct patient care, paid researcher or college research assistant, college teaching assistant in the sciences, medical missions, and other community service/volunteer experience related to healthcare).
- Based upon the quality of their application materials, the most competitive applicants will be invited for an interview on Zoom. ABSN Program admission decisions by the Chin School of Nursing will be communicated to all applicants via their e-mail address on or before Friday, March 28, 2025. Admission to the Chin School of Nursing / ABSN Program is also dependent on acceptance to the university itself. Final admission decisions will be made based upon this staged review process.
